In addition to the highly detailed tank motifs, the kit includes two modded crewmen loading ammunition and a senior officer.

MB3505 Separate tracks for models

The tracks designed for the PzKfw 1A in 1933 were used successfully on other AFVs utilized by the Wehrmacht during the course of WWII. The tacks offered in this kit can easily be removed from the sprues, and do not require any special processing or fitting. Using these tracks, the modeler can achieve a higher degree of realism in recreating sags and slack between the return rollers. Battle damage can also be effectively simulated this way.

Panzergrenadiers were motorized infanty, shock troops, often used in conjunction with amoon in this spanihead of an attack. The Panzergrenadiers would advance under cover of the accompanying tanks, mopping up any enemy infantry in the vicinity of the advance, Panzergrenadiers were essential to the German doctrine of Biltzkrieg. This kill contains 7 figures depicting Panzergrenadiers advancing under fire.





MB3519 U.S. Machine-gunners

The "Browning M1917A1" machine gun produced during WWI dld not meet the requirements of modern warfare, but it was excellent in the defensive role due to its great rate of sustained fire, and its pin-point accuracy.

On the beaches of Omaha, German troops put up a concerted defense against the landing Allied forces. The attacking 29th division lost over 60% of its fighting strength, and the first wave of infantry was completely wiped out.
